What is Art All-State?

Art All-State is 140 of the most talented and deserving high school junior art students from all over Massachusetts. Art All-State is artistic challenge, a late night, and, yes, pizza! Art All-State is a two-day event in late May at the Worcester Art Museum in Worcester, Massachusetts. Students nominated and accepted into the program spend two days working in studios directed by professional artists.

Art All-State projects are not like any you may have ever worked on at school. They are inspired by art from the Museum's collection and evolve as a team effort between the members of a studio group (usually about 18 students). The artists you work with may be architects or painters, or they may be working with new media. Art All-State is designed to help you explore artistic creativity rather than becoming more proficient in using certain materials.

In addition to intensive studio work, you will have the opportunity to meet sixteen different working artists, discover their thoughts about being artists, and meet your artistic peers from across the state. You'll make friendships, learn new things, and be inspired!

Should I attend?

If your teacher suggests that you should apply to Art All-State, feel honored. Each school can only nominate up to two candidates.

Apply to Art All-State if:

- You like art and think you might want to continue to study art
- You want to meet other students with similar interests
- You want to meet artists who can help you discover what it is like to have an art career
- You like art but are uncertain about art in your future.
